SCHOOL AGE PROGRAMS

Focus on STEAM & Social Emotional Learning

The Club operates five school age program sites in Huntington Beach and Fountain Valley:

- Haynes Family Branch
- Kingston Branch
- Oak View Branch
- Oak View ELOP Branch - *New Location Opened in Fall 2022!*
- Pacific Life Foundation Branch

Together, these sites served more than 1,000 children each day in 2022. With your help, the Club made a positive impact on children from 39 schools in five local school districts.

The Club is so much more than affordable childcare. Our programs are focused on positive youth development outcomes. Nationwide, kids are struggling to catch up both academically and socially after the disrupted school years brought on by the pandemic. To help kids stay on track, the Club offers enrichment activities led by caring, well-trained staff every day that are designed to help youth succeed in school and in life.

“Helping kids get on track with math and science is a top priority for us. Standardized tests in 2022 showed that only 45% of Orange County youth are meeting the standards for math. We want every child at our Clubs to be able to excel in math and science, so we’ve focused on making learning STEAM fun and engaging - and it’s working. More than 60% of our members say they are interested in pursuing a career in a STEM field,” says CEO Art Groeneveld.

Thanks to generous donations and partnerships with groups like Bridgestone, Genesis Inspiration Foundation, Hoag Foundation, Hyundai, Imagine Science, Panda Cares, SciEd Foundation, and many others, the Club was able to provide fantastic learning opportunities for kids. Activities like Data Detectives, Imagine Science, DIY STEM, robotics, learning to code, using 3D printers, and many others all gave kids the opportunity to have hands-on fun while they

learned about science, technology, engineering, and math.

Social Emotional Learning, sometimes called SEL, is a key part of children’s development, too. It’s become especially important for kids today, who missed out on two school years of learning to make friends and navigate new situations and relationships. The Club uses programs like Triple Play, the Mind and Heart curriculum, and mentoring programs to help youth build up their sense of self-worth, learn self-control and good decision making, learn to be a good friend, and develop positive relationships with caring adults.

With support from the Club’s caring staff, the kids at all five of our school age Clubs are getting back on track academically and socially. With continued opportunities to learn and grow while they are having fun at the Club, they are laying the foundation for their great future!



CHILD DEVELOPMENT PRESCHOOLS

*Childcare that
Families Can Count On -
Preparing Children
for Success in School*

Every step of the journey, the Boys & Girls Club is here to help kids succeed. Starting with children who are just 6 weeks old, the Club provides loving care for more than 200 children every day at our Learning Center Child Development Preschool and Robert Mayer Child Development Preschool. These two sites help children up to age six lay the foundation for a lifetime of success through infant and toddler care, preschool programs, and transitional kindergarten. Using curriculum aligned with the Common Core standards, the Club's preschoolers learn the early fundamentals of reading, writing, math, and science that will help them thrive in school. They also learned friendship building, problem solving, empathy, and being part of



a community. From potty training, to reading, to learning to share, our preschool teachers focus on providing a nurturing environment that helps each child begin to become independent and develop at their own pace.

There are two big priorities that the Club's staff hear from most parents when they share what they need from our preschools. First, they want their children to be well cared for in an environment where they can be safe, learn, play, and feel loved. Second, they need reliable care so that they are able to work

and provide for their families. Our preschools make sure every family has the reliable, high quality childcare that they need for their children.

One parent shares, "I have guardianship of four of my nieces and nephews, all siblings, in order to keep the children together and avoid foster care. As their primary caretaker, I am responsible to pay for full-time daycare and after school care for the children, as well as rent for a space large enough for all four children, and my own personal financial obligations and responsibilities.

This impacts my circumstances significantly by causing additional financial burden, stress, and loss of wages if I am unable to work. The preschool makes it possible for me to go to work and gives my four-year-old nephew a familiar, stable, and safe environment. His three older siblings also attend the Boys & Girls Clubs of Huntington Valley. They made connections with the staff and other children and look forward to coming to the Club each day. The Boys & Girls Club makes a big difference for our family."



CLUBHOUSE ACADEMY & SPORTS

Gives Members a Moment in the Spotlight

With 50 performing arts classes at ClubHouse Academy and 75+ sports games and practices offered every week, Club members grow their talents with hard work, practice, and often develop a lifelong love for their activities. Through dancing, singing, acting, volleyball, basketball, soccer, gymnastics and karate, children get to be active and have their own moment to shine, whether it's on stage or in the game.

Through our partnerships locally and nationally, our ClubHouse Academy performers were able to share their talents with a broad audience. Not only did they perform in showcases for family and friends, they also performed at Fountain Valley's tree lighting ceremony, the Festival of Children, our Club's Great Futures Start Here Annual Benefit Dinner & Auction, Boys & Girls Clubs of America's Pacific Region Conference, and Boys & Girls Clubs of America's Youth of the Year Gala.

At the Youth of the Year event, the kids got to meet Misty Copeland, a Boys & Girls Club alum who is the Prima Ballerina for the world renowned American

Ballet Theatre. Dance Director Allison Horner shares, "As a dancer who got her start at a Boys & Girls Club, Misty Copeland is a huge inspiration to all of our dancers who were performing at the event – two have even done school reports on her! She met all the kids, watched them rehearse, and even gave them a pep talk!!! It was a truly magical day for our dancers."

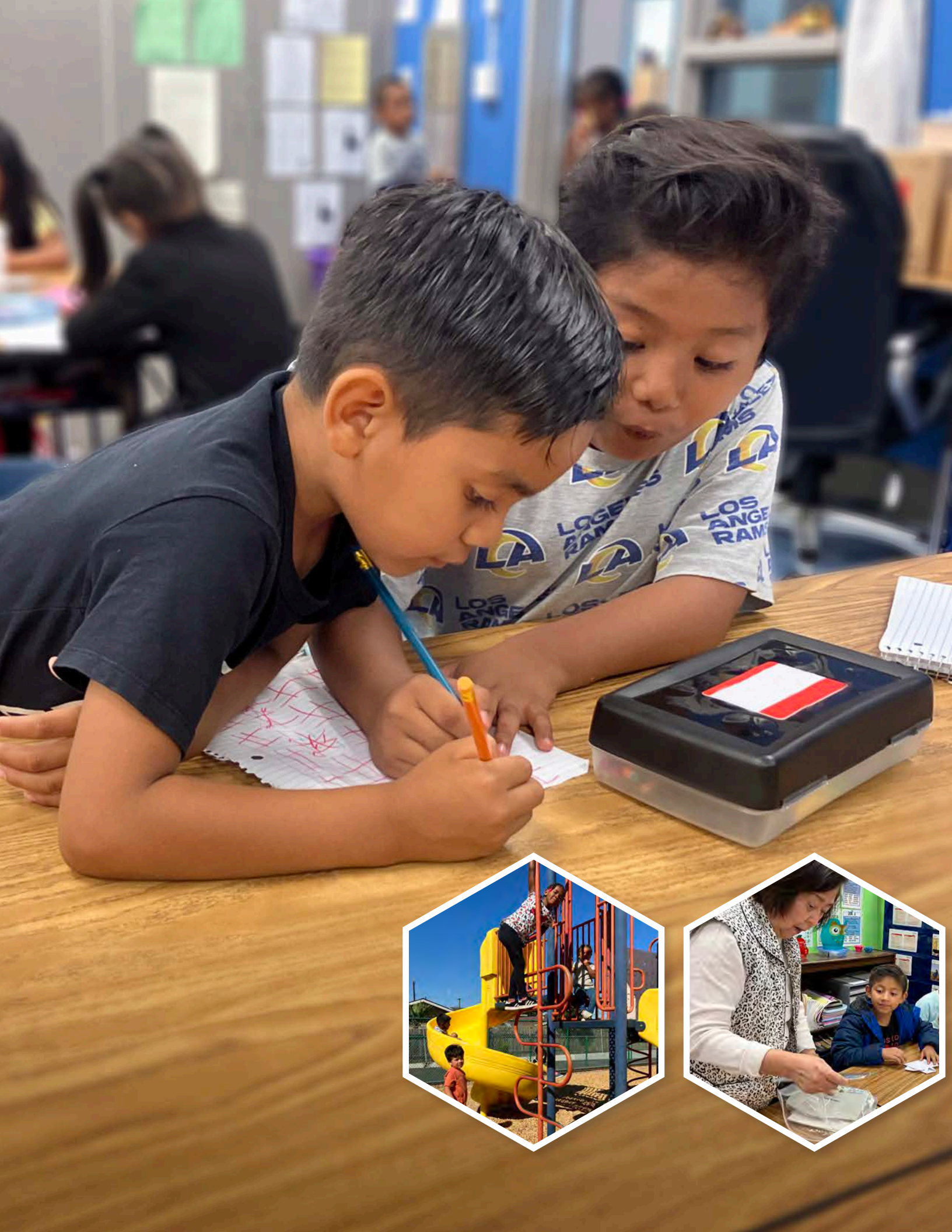

8TH PROGRAM LOCATION OPENED

to Serve More Youth in the Oak View Community

Thanks to a new partnership with the Ocean View School District and Oak View Elementary, the Club was able to open an 8th branch right on campus at Oak View Elementary. Made possible through funding from the State of California's Extended Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP), this new location allows the Club to double its footprint in Huntington Beach's most impoverished area. Not only that, the new site allows the Club to fill a childcare gap in the community by serving new age groups, like TK and Kindergarteners. Within just a few weeks of opening, the Club had filled four classrooms with 80 children attending each day. The program is slated to grow to reach an additional 50 children in 2023.

The kids in Oak View are among the youth in our community who need the Boys & Girls Club the most. At Oak View Elementary, 97% of all students qualify for free and reduced price lunches. For a family of four to qualify for free lunch, the household income must be less than \$34,000 per year. While struggling to pay for the basics like rent and food, their families don't have the resources to provide

after school tutors or fun enrichment activities like dance classes, robotics or sports. That's where the Boys & Girls Club's free afterschool program comes in!

Each day, the Club's staff help kids with homework in our Power Hour program and guide children in enrichment activities that support their learning in reading, math and other core subjects. STEM programs like Imagine Science, Jr. encourage kids to participate in hands-on STEM challenges and activities that reinforce what they're learning at school in fun new ways. The Club's programs focus on a lot more than academic support, too. Coming out of the pandemic, a time filled with isolation and stress, the Club's staff emphasizes social emotional learning in all of our programs. Kids learn friendship building skills, develop positive relationships with peers and caring adults, learn to work together in small groups, develop resiliency skills, and build a positive sense of self. Kids also have a chance to play sports, take dance classes, and be active outside each day, learn healthy habits, and most of all, have fun!





TWILIGHT EDUCATION PROJECT

Program Returns After Two Year Pandemic Pause

After a two year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Club's Twilight Education Project returned in September 2022 to once again help English learner families gain the skills they need to succeed. The program is run in partnership with several local school districts, Huntington Beach Adult School, and Golden West College. By leveraging our resources together, the Club and its partners are able to provide educational opportunities for whole families, from toddlers, to school age kids, to teens, to parents. Every member of the family has the opportunity to learn and grow.

Three nights per week, in Golden West College classrooms, and at the Club's on-campus school age branch and preschool, families come to learn English and get the support they need to succeed. Parents participate in English as a Second Language classes and parenting education classes in college classrooms. At the same time, elementary and high school students get homework help, tutoring, mentoring, and an opportunity to participate in Boys & Girls Club enrichment

activities. And, younger children participate in English language focused preschool programs.

To break down barriers to service for families, the program is offered in the evening after typical work hours and the Club's fleet of buses provide transportation between Golden West College and targeted neighborhoods with a high English learner population. Meals are provided for children each evening by Second Harvest Food Bank since the program runs through the dinner hour and Surf City Rotary provides food for families to take home on the weekend. Best of all, thanks to generous supporters like you, the entire program is offered free of charge to families.

The program came back strong! Twilight ended the year with 100 children participating, from infants to 12th graders. And, more than 65 parents participated in ESL classes and parenting education workshops. The program is bringing together families who speak Arabic, Vietnamese, Spanish, and more, and helping all of them find the path toward their great future in our community.



SCHOLARSHIPS

Change Families' Lives for the Better

This year, the Club provided more than **\$620,000 in scholarships** for families who were struggling financially. Thanks to the generosity of supporters like you, the Club is able to give families a helping hand when they need it most.

Community partnerships are vital to helping the children and families at our Clubs who need us the most.

Through the generosity, resources, and expertise of many groups throughout the community, the Club is able to do Whatever It Takes to help children thrive.

We'd like to say a special thanks to our partners who helped with the following projects that enriched the lives of our Club members and helped our whole community be stronger.

- **Vaccination Clinics:** Thanks to support from MemorialCare – Orange Coast Medical Center, the Orange County Healthcare Agency, Golden West College, and the State of California, the Club was able to provide COVID-19 vaccines to Club members and the community at large.
- **AED Donation and Training:** To keep our Club community safe, Huntington Beach Hospital donated an AED for each site. The Huntington Beach Fire Department volunteered their time to train our staff. Thanks to these two groups, the Club is ready for cardiac emergencies.
- **Greatness Amplified:** Hoag Hospital, G&M Oil, Mike & Sloan Gallipeo, John Bishop & Barbara Nieto, Resa Evans and Dave Theil, and hundreds of generous donors came together to raise more than \$200,000 in the Club's one-day giving challenge.
- **Special Events:** 600 community members came together for the Club's Great Futures Start Here Annual Benefit Dinner and Auction, with Kingston Technology leading the way as the event's title sponsor. Four gift giving parties hosted by board members and local businesses helped the community learn about the Club and provided hundreds of amazing auction items. The JMG Security Systems Benefit Golf Tournament, hosted by Pacific Premier Bank, brought together nearly 300 golfers in support of the kids at the Club. And, through our partnerships with Surf City Rotary and their Splash event and Fountain Valley Kiwanis Club and their Pins for Kids event, the Boys & Girls Club benefited from even more community members showing their support. These events build community, raise awareness about the work the Club does, and provide much needed funds to keep our programs operating.
- **Food and Nutrition:** Through our partnerships with Second Harvest Food Bank and Caterina's Club, the Boys & Girls Club is able to offer a meal to every child at our Clubs, every day we operate. That means no child ever has to go hungry when they are at the Club! Grocery Outlet's Independence From Hunger Program, Target, and Surf City Rotary helped provide food for families throughout the year so kids can get enough to eat at home, too.
- **Shopping Trips, End of Year Giving, and Holiday Parties:** Throughout the year, Surf City Rotary and Fountain Valley Kiwanis made sure children in our scholarship program had clothing essentials and shoes that fit on special shopping trips. The Club raised more than \$100,000 in year-end donations thanks to a matching gift challenge. And, groups like Surf City Rotary, Fountain Valley and Huntington Beach Kiwanis Clubs, CHP, Coldwell Banker-Campbell Realtors, the local firefighters' Spark of Love program, G&M Oil, Tickets.com, Major League Baseball, the SeaCliff Neighbors, and many others helped give the children at the Club a holiday to remember. These special moments let children know that the whole community cares about them!

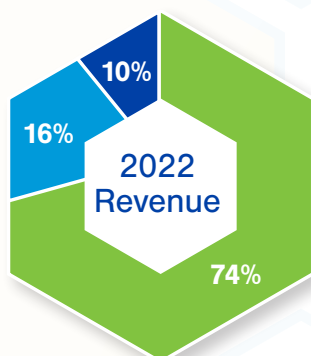

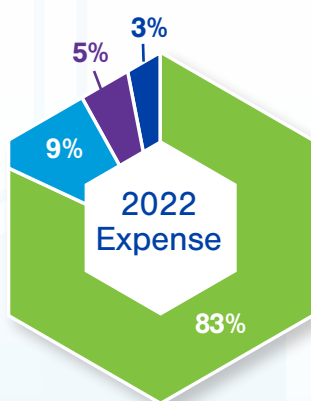

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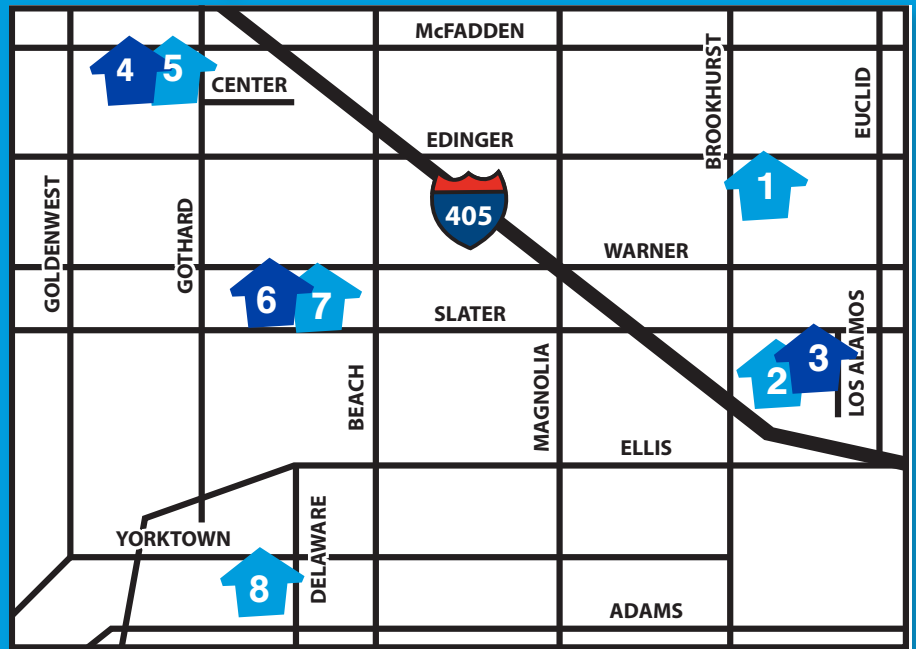


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
