

New ELOP Partnerships with School Districts

Club Grows through Free After School Programs

Boys & Girls Clubs of Huntington Valley is proud to announce new partnerships with the Huntington Beach City School District and the Ocean View School District to offer afterschool enrichment programs for children in 14 Huntington Beach schools. The Club will provide free after school programs for children in grades TK-6 who qualify for free and reduced price lunches, are homeless, and/or are foster youth.

Through these collaborations, the Club's enrollment will grow significantly. In partnership with the Ocean View School District, the Club opened a new location at the Oak View Elementary School campus last school year and a brand new location on the campus of Westmont Elementary School this summer. Students from four other Ocean View schools will be bused to our Clubs for afterschool





programs this fall. And, children from all eight schools in the Huntington Beach City School District will be part of the afterschool program at our Haynes Huntington Beach Branch. In all, the Club expects to reach more than 600 children free of charge thanks to funding from the State of California's Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP).



Whether kids are at our new sites on their school campuses, or being bused to one of our dedicated youth facilities, kids will have access to the Club's wide variety of programs including homework help, STEM and reading programs, sports activities, arts and crafts, leadership development, and social emotional learning. The program will be offered every school day, as well as during school breaks and holidays to maximize children's opportunities for growth and learning.

"The Club is very proud to partner with both school districts for the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program. The school districts and the Club have a common goal – we want every child to be able to succeed both in the classroom and in the community," said CEO Art Groeneveld. "Our afterschool program will build on what kids are being taught at school so that every child has the support they need to succeed. And, at the Boys & Girls Club, fun is always one of our top priorities. Our goal for each of the kids in the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program is for them to be excited to come to the Club and learn something new each day."

48% of kids in Orange County count on free and reduced price lunches at school to make sure that they get enough to eat. However, during the summer, kids don't have access to those resources and one out of every eight kids doesn't always know where their next meal is coming from.

At our Clubs, we are committed to making sure that no child ever goes hungry. We are so thankful to our many community partners who help us honor that commitment.



- Target Twice each week, all year long, the Club picks up groceries to share with our Club members' families and to use in our teaching kitchens.
- Grocery Outlet Throughout the month of July, Grocery Outlet – Fountain Valley donates thousands of dollars of food through the Independence from Hunger campaign. Food is used in our teaching kitchens to provide snacks and meals for kids as well as handed out directly by the Club to families.
- Caterina's Club The charitable arm of Bruno Serato's Anaheim White House Restaurant provides a pasta meal for every child who wants it at our Kingston, Haynes HB, and Pacific Life Foundation Branches every day we operate.
- Second Harvest Food Bank The food bank provides daily meals and snacks all school year and all summer long for kids at our Oak View Branch.

Helping Kids Become Fluent Readers

Intergenerational Reading Program Comes to Haynes HB Branch

The Haynes Huntington Beach Branch is welcoming back volunteers from the Parentis Foundation and the AARP Foundation Experience Corps OC for a full school year of reading tutoring. Every week throughout the school year, seniors will volunteer as reading tutors, meeting with students in grades K-3 twice a week to provide consistent reading support. The goal of the program is to help children who are not reading at grade level become fluent readers by the end of third grade. Unit Director Ryan Gassis shares, "We're so excited to welcome back the volunteers from Parentis Foundation. They are so dedicated and supportive of our kids, and we are really glad they will be here to give our Club members the help they need to get on track with reading. Teachers tell us that that third grade is a critical

year for developing reading fluency. Up to that point, kids are learning to read, but in 4th grade and beyond, kids are reading to learn."
