Club Members Build Resilience Through Equine Therapy

Free Rein Horse Sanctuary Helps Kids and Horses

This spring, the Club teamed up with Free Rein to offer twelve members of our Oak View Branch an incredible opportunity to participate in Equine-Assisted Learning (EAL) sessions under the expert guidance of trained facilitators and equine specialists. This special opportunity was coordinated by the Huntington Beach Auto Dealers Association. In the course, youth ages 11-13 learned about resilience by working with horses rescued from abuse, now living at Free Rein Sanctuary. Each week, the group explored a new theme: building trust with horses, enhancing communication skills, setting and respecting boundaries, and understanding emotions. Safety was a priority, with each session beginning with a thorough briefing on interacting with the horses. The program also featured special guests - police officers from the Huntington

A Year of Dedicated Tutoring with the Parentis Foundation and AARP Experience Corps OC


In partnership with the Parentis Foundation and AARP Foundation Experience Corps OC, the Haynes Huntington Beach Branch has welcomed back volunteers for a full school year of reading tutoring. Senior volunteers meet with students in grades K-3 twice a week to provide consistent reading support. The goal of the program is to help children who are not reading at grade level become fluent readers by the end of third grade. This school year, our dedicated volunteers spent more than 460 hours tutoring students one-onone, invested over 390 hours in tutor training, and conducted more than 1,100 tutoring sessions. Unit Director Ryan Gassis shares, "We are so thankful for the volunteers from the Parentis Foundation! We received so much positive feedback from parents who saw an improvement in their child's reading fluency and confidence this year. Our members are excited to go to Reading Club, always asking when they get to read with their tutors again. We can't wait to welcome the tutors back in the Fall!"
