SCHOOL AGE PROGRAMS

Award Winning Programs for Kids in Grades K – 8

In 2024, the Club was committed to serving more kids and deepening the positive impact the Club has on each child. We are excited to share that we grew from six school age program sites last year to nine. Thanks to our partnership with the Ocean View School District, the Club opened three new sites on school campuses serving children free of charge through the State of California's grant funded Expanded Learning Opportunities Program. The Club's nine school age sites in Huntington Beach and Fountain Valley include:

- Oak View Branch

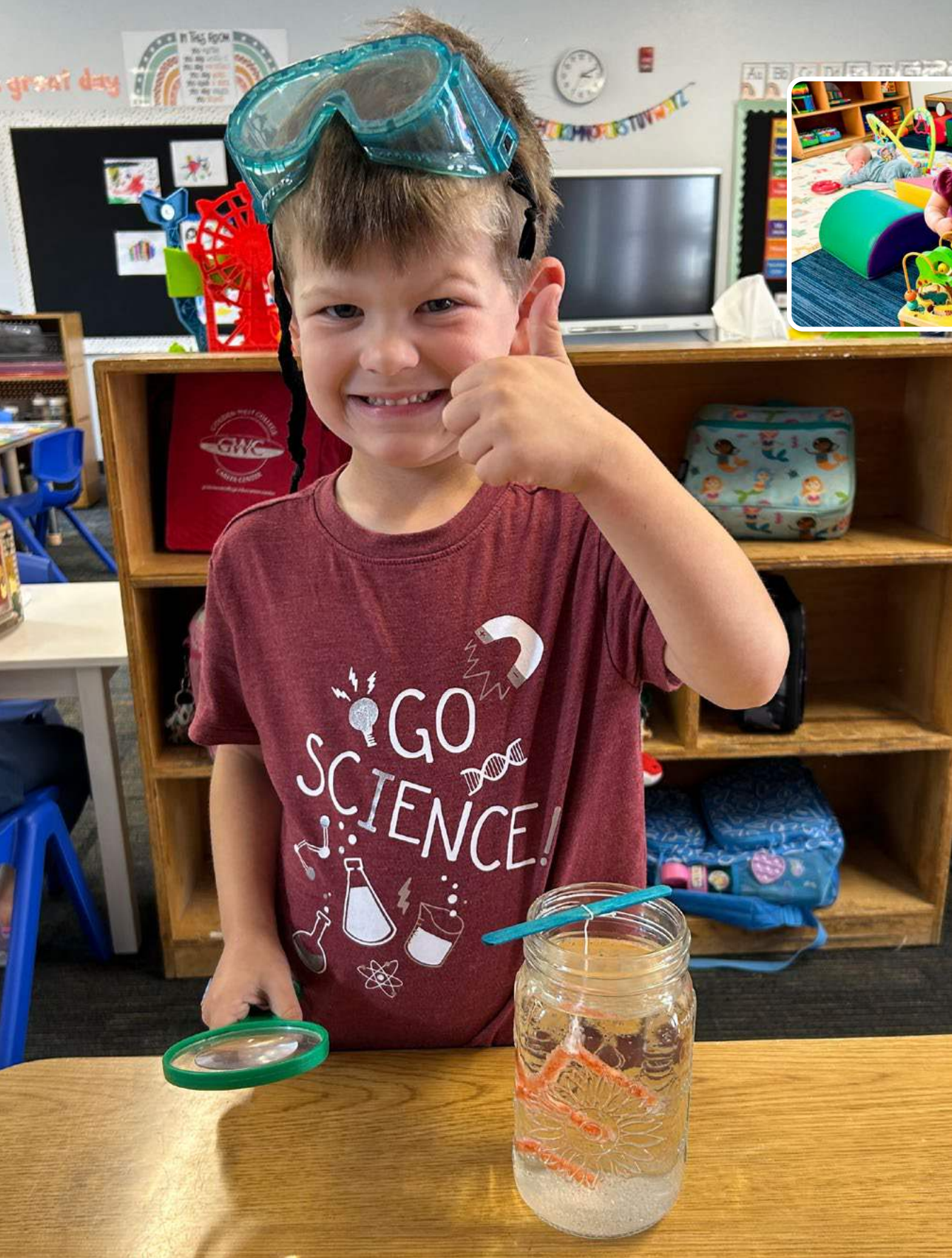

These sites helped over **1,400 children daily**. Your support allowed the Club to make a positive difference for **children from more than 40 schools in five local school districts**.

Each day at the Club, kids get to learn, play, explore, and grow through programs designed to help kids reach their full potential. In the Club's safe and fun environment, youth get academic support to help them succeed in school, get to explore their creativity in our arts programs, get active in sports, learn how to be a good friend and member of a community, and so much more.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT PRESCHOOLS

Loving, Quality Care that Families Can Afford

From a new parent's first day back to work until their child's first day of kindergarten, the Boys & Girls Club's two **preschools are here to make sure that moms, dads, and their precious little ones have everything they need to succeed.** Our Learning Center and Robert Mayer Child Development Preschools provide reliable childcare that parents can always count for more than 225 children ages six weeks old to six years old.

Every step of the way, the **Club provides loving care and a supportive learning environment that helps each child develop essential skills and early fundamentals that help them learn, play, explore, and grow.** A great new addition to our preschool learning environment in 2024 was a "calming center" provided by Orange County

Department of Education's Quality Start program. It's a wonderful new tool for helping young children learn to manage their emotions. Our teachers attended Social Emotional Foundations of Early Learning trainings on how to implement this new area and develop new skills to help children with their social emotional development. With lavender scent containers, fidget pop its, a weighted stuffed animal, sand toys, books about emotions, noise canceling headphones, and breathing cards, we provided space for the children to learn to self-regulate their emotions when feeling frustrated or upset. Parents, teachers, and staff love this new area because they see the children choose to go to the calming center when they know they are getting anxious. Our preschoolers are developing critical life skills from the earliest ages.

CLUBHOUSE ACADEMY & ATHLETICS

Helping Youth Discover and Pursue Their Passions

More than 900 youth are part of ClubHouse Academy's basketball, soccer, volleyball, martial arts, dance, musical theatre, gymnastics, and music programs. What sets the Club's sports and performing arts programs apart is the **extraordinary quality combined with accessibility**. While there are many elite, expensive arts academies and sports clubs in our community for affluent families, ClubHouse Academy makes sure that its high quality programs are affordable for everyone.

We know that **our kids deserve the best**, so that's exactly what we give them. For example, many of our martial arts classes are led by former members of Team USA Karate. Our basketball, volleyball, and soccer clinics have former NBA, VBA, and MLS players involved. And our acting, dance, and music programs are led by professional performers and arts educators. The result is a group of outstanding quality programs that nurtures kids at all levels

and abilities, from brand new beginners to experienced performers and athletes, including a member of Jr. Team USA Karate and teens who have become working actors and dancers.

One of the best things about ClubHouse Academy is the way it makes kids feel when they're part of it. One of our members who is a senior in high school this year shares, "**I came to realize that ClubHouse is my home**. It's where I have found my sense of worth, my sense of belonging that I had desired my whole life. The fear of being myself was dispelled. I had finally been freed to express who I am. I see no world in which ClubHouse doesn't remain in my heart - Once a ClubHouse kid, always a ClubHouse kid. I have made lifelong friends here, and memories to last a lifetime. I hope one day, when I am older and have a few kids of my own, they could become ClubHouse kids just like I did."

FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP) & Twilight Education Project

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program

Through partnerships with the Huntington Beach City School District and the Ocean View School District, the Club provides afterschool and summer programs FREE OF CHARGE for more than 1,000 children. These partnerships are part of the State of California's Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP).

Through ELOP, the Club is furthering our mission of helping the kids who need us most. 100% of children in the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program are English Language Learners or come from low-income households that **qualify for free or reduced price lunches, are homeless, or are foster youth.**

ELOP participants from 11 schools are bused to our Clubs each day, with most at our Haynes Family Huntington Beach Branch. At the same time, the Club also operates five sites on the campuses Oak View, Westmont, Circle View*, Lake View*, and Golden View Elementary Schools* in the Ocean View School District (*New in 2024).

Each of these school sites serve between 100-200 youth daily, giving kids the support they need to succeed in school and in life.

During their time with the Club kids get homework help, reading tutoring, mentoring, STEM programs, arts programs, life skills programs, sports activities, and so much more. The Club is thrilled to partner with our local school districts to support the children who need us most.

Twilight Education Project

In partnership with local school districts and Huntington Beach Adult School, the Club helps English Language Learner families gain the skills they need to succeed in our English speaking community. This year, the program has a new location in the heart of Huntington Beach's Oak View neighborhood, a community with thousands of English learner families. Three nights per week parents learn ESL while their school age children get homework help and academic support and enrichment activities at the Club. The whole family has a chance to learn and grow - all free of charge!

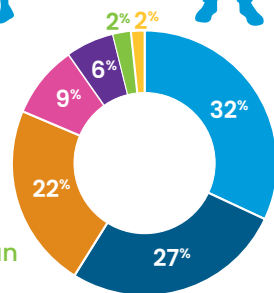

National Recognition from Boys & Girls Clubs of America

2024 was a banner year for our Club with our entire organization and several of our key leaders gaining recognition from Boys & Girls Clubs of America for their dedication and impact.

At the Boys & Girls Clubs of America National Conference in May, our Club received the **Roxanne Spillett Honor Award for Community Collaboration** for the amazing work that our staff and community partners do through the Imagine Science program. Led by our COO Ryan Brenes, who is on the Imagine Science Orange County steering committee, we work with the Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove, Girls Inc., and 4-H to make the most of each other's talents and resources, giving kids hands-on STEM education opportunities that get them excited about science.

At the Boys & Girls Clubs of America Pacific Region Conference in October, both a board member and a staff

member were honored for their exceptional leadership. **Wink Williams** was named the **Area Council Chair of the Year** for his work in guiding all the Boys & Girls Clubs in Orange County. And our Chief Advancement Officer **Laura Portier-LaLumiere** was named the **Outstanding Development Professional of the Year** for her leadership of our organization's fundraising efforts.

And last, but certainly not least, we got to celebrate with **Ed Arnold** at our annual benefit in November when he received the **Jim Newland Lifetime Achievement Award**, honoring more than 55 years of dedication to this Club that he helped found back in 1967.

Help Build a New Performing Arts Space

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Huntington Valley provides **award-winning arts education experiences at our ClubHouse Academy Center for the Performing Arts in Fountain Valley**. More than 50 classes are offered each week in:

- Acting
- Voice
- Dancing
- Gymnastics
- Piano
- Karate

Kids describe ClubHouse Academy as their second home, their second family, and the place where they feel like they belong. For many kids, it's the one place they feel like they can be creative and truly be themselves.

After renting space for nearly 20 years, **it is time for the Club to create a new permanent home for our performing arts and martial arts programs.**

The Club is undertaking the Chasing Dreams campaign to **add 6,000 square feet to the Kingston Branch** located

at Mile Square Park in Fountain Valley. At the same time, the Club will update and renovate the entire facility, which is about 30 years old. When complete, this new space will ensure that kids in our community can always count on the Club to provide outstanding arts education opportunities and a special home away from home.

We are especially grateful to Kingston Technology and the Mayer Family Foundation for each leading off our Chasing Dreams campaign with a \$500,000 gift toward the \$5 million that will be needed to complete the project.

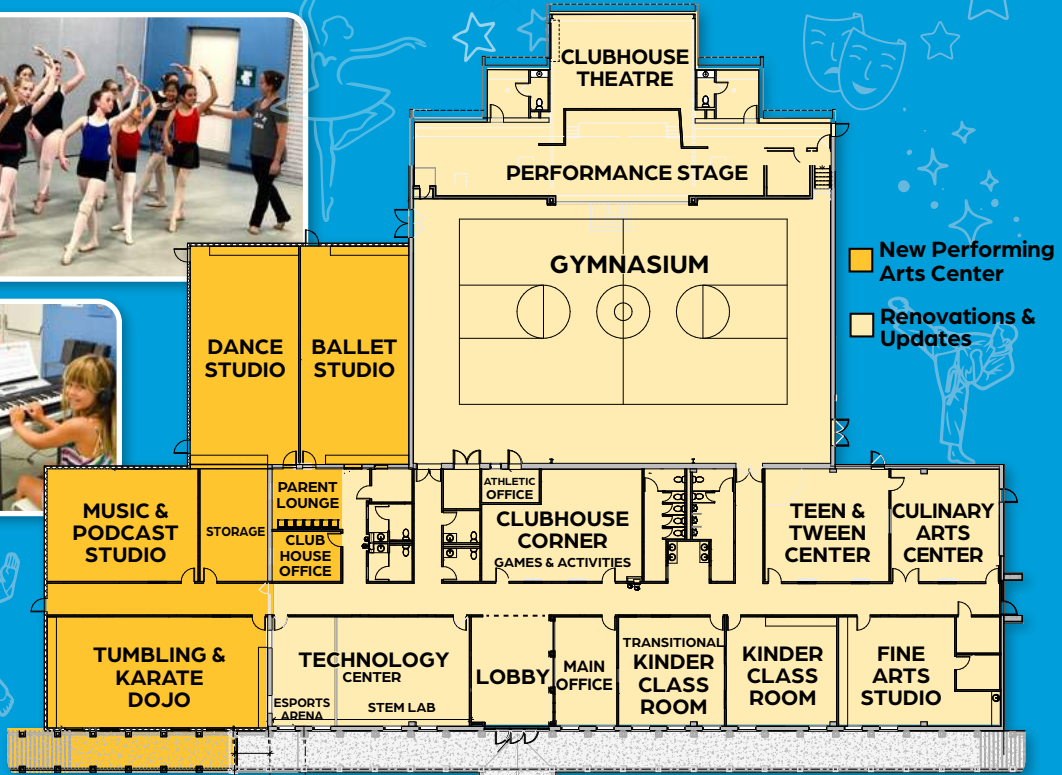
Preliminary Architectural Drawings for the new Performing Arts Center at our Kingston Fountain Valley Branch



6,000 square foot Performing Arts Center



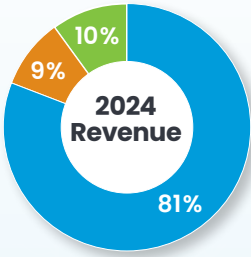

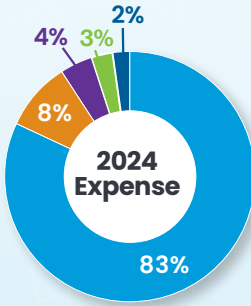

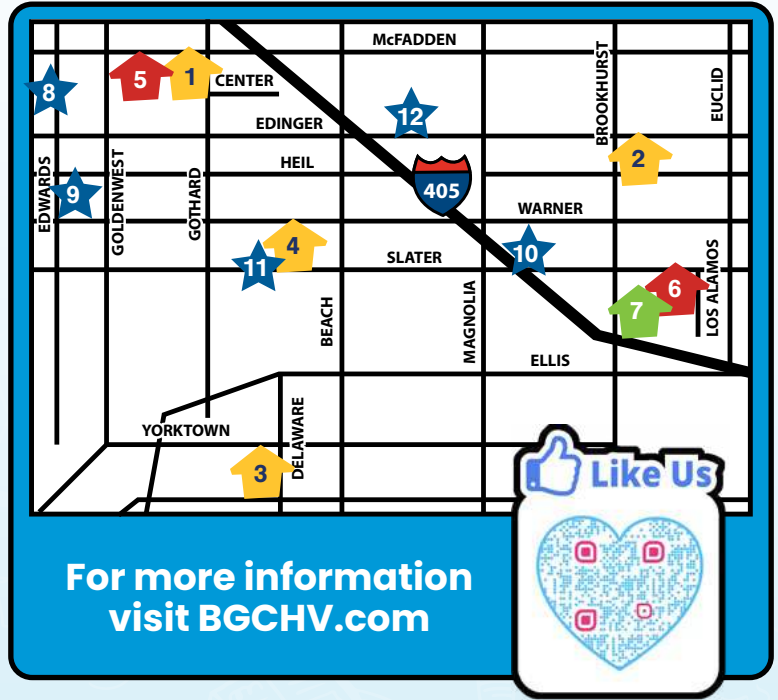
